

Safer Internet Day

'Together for a better internet'

Safer internet day is a day that is celebrated globally on 11th February this year. We are all aware that both adults and children are all using the internet to socialise, play games and to shop online. At PACE we thought it would be a great opportunity to make our cohort aware of how to be safe on the internet, how to be kind on the internet and what they can do if someone isn't being kind to them.

Each class had a separate session relating to e-safety.

Our key stage 2 classes discussed their online identity and how to be safe when online gaming, as we all know the dangers and positives of socialising online. The children in Oak and Rowan class were all very enthusiastic when discussing ideas of how they can be safe and why it is important to be kind online. They discussed that they should block, report and tell an adult if anyone says anything inappropriate to them. It was also explained that some people do pretend to be someone else and it was emphasised that we all need to be very careful and must tell an adult if anything worries them.

Our key stage 1 class created their own online profile, discussing how important it is to be true to yourself. They discussed different things that they should and should not upload or show online about themselves.

Internet Safety Day has had a great impact on our school environment and all children have since been very careful whilst being online.
