









Oak Class – Home Learning Grid for English

<p>Read a book, magazine, comic etc. AFTER reading, get someone at home to ask you 3 quiz questions about what you have read. Write 2 quiz questions about the book. See if your family member can answer them.</p>	<p>Create your own mini book about you! You could include pictures, drawings and copies of things that are important to you. You could start from when you were just a baby</p>	<p>Create your own information leaflet about a country of your choice. You could include pictures, drawings and/ or pictures that you find online.</p>	<p>Write a poem about feelings and emotions.</p> 
<p>Design a poster advertising an imagined water park. How will you ensure that people visit? Make sure you use your persuasive writing skills.</p>	<p>Become a news reporter and research any devastating floods that have occurred. Write a report to read to someone at home.</p> 	<p>Write an argument about whether schools should be open or closed at the moment. Remember to consider both sides of the argument and finish with your own opinion.</p>	<p>Write a factual recount about your favourite day. This may be a birthday, day out or Christmas. It's totally up to you.</p> 
<p>Write 10 alliterative silly sentences. Remember each word begins with the same letter. Example: Thomas the turtle teetered towards the toilet.</p>	<p>Find the homophones for the following words and draw a picture for each word to show that it means something different.</p> <p>here, male, main, brake, scene, great, he'll, bury</p>	<p>What's the difference between grownups and children? Write down your answer AND then discuss with someone you live with. Write down their answer. Remember to support your reasoning.</p>	<p>Create a tourism brochure for St Helens. <p>Practise using a ruler to measure small items around the house in centimetres and millimetres. Show your calculations.</p> 	<p>Write out your times tables that you are doing in class without using</p>	<p>TV Time... Choose your favourite TV programme. How many minutes long is it? <p>Make a set of 'Animal top trumps'. Information to include: Height, length and weight. Play the game against a friend (highest number wins both cards, the person with the most cards wins)</p>	<p>Create word problems for a friend or family member that include addition, subtraction, multiplication and division sums. Think carefully about the information that you include and check that they make sense.</p>	<p>Create a bar graph showing how many portions of fruit and veg you eat for a week.</p> 	<p>Create a 3D model of a 3D shape of your choice. Make a label for it explaining the number of edges, faces, vertices and it's mathematical name.</p>

Why is it so famous? Why is it still relevant each time we watch the Olympics?</p>	<p>Write a poem about your favourite sport. Why do you prefer this sport to others? Remember to think of your senses; What can you smell, taste, hear, feel and see?</p>
<p>Design a poster advertising the ancient Greek Olympics. How will you ensure that people visit? Make sure you use your persuasive writing skills.</p>	<p>Create a line graph showing your heart rate before and after exercise. What is the difference between your heart rate when you are active and when you are resting? Why is this?</p>	<p>Can you create a poster that invites Muslim people to an Eid-ul-Fitr celebration party? When do Muslim people have this party? Is it a special time for them? Do you think they deserve a party after Ramadan?</p>	<p>Can you create a diet for a sportsman's day? Create a diet sheet and on it write down all the food that a top athlete would eat for a day. Remember to include proteins and carbohydrates as well as lots of fruit and vegetables.</p>
