Dinosaur Day - Cherry Class

As part of our wider curriculum this Autumn Term our cherry class are focusing on Dinosaurs. At PACE we consider our wider curriculum very important and a great opportunity for them to experience/learn things that they may not get the chance to at home.

The children began their day with some free play and explorative activities that were all dinosaur themed. There were dinosaur stories, dinosaur jigsaws, and dinosaur figures with backdrops for the children to actively practise role play. These morning activities are important for children to develop socially as they get to interact with both peers and staff whilst developing their own story telling and gross motor skills.
