<p>World War 2</p> <p>Children will find out where and when WW2 took place, what life was like for those living through the war, how people coped with the conflict in their daily lives. Learn the reasons why evacuation happened during WW2 and where children were sent to live. Learn about the reasons for rationing and the make do and mend culture promoted during the war.</p>	<p>Romans</p> <p>Explore the story of how Rome was founded by Romulus and Remus and how the city expanded into an empire. Investigate how society was structured in ancient Rome and what daily life was like for the ancient Romans. Explore what the ancient Romans believed in and who their gods and goddesses were. Investigate the use of symbolism in art and create a piece of artwork to portray a Roman myth.</p> <p>Identify Italy and its major cities on a map and explore its geographical features. Identify similarities and differences between Italy and Britain.</p>

<p>Chocolate</p> <p>Exploring the origins of the cocoa bean and comparing its uses in the Aztec and Mayan cultures. Finding out how the cocoa bean came to Europe and looking at different people's viewpoints of the product. Finding out where in the world cocoa trees grow, and why they grow there. Exploring what happens to a cocoa pod once it is harvested, and how it is turned into a chocolate product. Comparing and contrasting the life of a Ghanaian farmer with that of a British farmer.</p>	<p>Rainforests</p> <p>Discover where the rainforests are in the world and locate them on a world map. Explore what it is like in a rainforest and learn about the four main layers of vegetation. Define the word 'climate' and use charts and graphs to explore the climate of tropical rainforests. Discover the indigenous rainforest tribes and compare their lives with life in modern society. Explore how the rainforests are under threat and the actions that we can take to help save them.</p>

<p>Egyptians</p> <p>Introducing the ancient Egyptians, placing key events on a timeline, and learning the difference between AD and BC. Investigate the social structure of ancient Egyptian societies.</p> <p>Discover what the pyramids were built for and explore what tomb paintings can tell us about life in ancient Egypt.</p> <p>Find Egypt on a map and identify the continent Egypt is part of, as well as the seas which are next to it. Discover the geographical features of Egypt including its climate and population. Investigate what Egypt would be like as a holiday destination. Investigate geographical features of the River Nile including statistics and uses of the river.</p>	<p>Tudors</p> <p>Explore the Tudor family tree. Look at Tudor fashion through pictures and identify different pieces of Tudor clothing. Discover the punishments given to criminals during Tudor times and who was in charge of law and order. Think about what life was like for children in Tudor times, investigating the differences between rich and poor lifestyles.</p> <p>Explore how the physical and human geography of England has changed since the Tudor era. Locate the countries and oceans Tudor explorers such as Francis Drake travelled to and discovered.</p>
