<p><b>Goal Setting and Routines</b> <i>Book Focus - Once Upon an Ordinary School Day by Colin McNaughton</i></p> <p>As the children return to school routine after the summer holidays, they will be reading the story 'Once Upon an Ordinary School Day' and exploring the themes of routine and goals. The children will be given the opportunity to develop their own goals and targets for the academic year and create their own 'Extra Ordinary day at PACE'.</p> <p>The children will be encouraged to participate in group games and challenges to develop social skills such as turn taking, teamwork and communication.</p>	<p><b>Antibullying</b> <i>Story Focus – Story animation Wing on Literacy Shed</i></p> <p>Within this half the children will watch an animated story that explores the theme of antibullying. The children will be given the opportunity to discuss what they have seen and create their own strategies for dealing with bullying and encouraging others to be kind.</p> <p>The children will be encouraged to participate in group games and challenges to develop social skills such as turn taking, teamwork and communication.</p>
	<p><b>Christmas</b> <i>Book Focus – A variety of Christmas stories.</i></p> <p>In the lead up to Christmas, the children will read a fun Christmas story whilst taking part in hands-on, interactive activities to prepare us all for the festive season. They will focus on developing social skills through a variety of activities whilst working together as a team.</p>

<p><b>Mental Health and Developing Empathy</b> <i>Book Focus – Small Things by Mel Tregonning</i></p> <p>The children will be looking at a wordless novel that will provide them with the opportunity to develop an understanding about mental health and discover ways in which they can support themselves and others.</p> <p>The children will be encouraged to participate in group games and challenges to develop social skills such as turn taking, teamwork and communication.</p>	<p><b>Positivity and Growth Mindset</b> <i>Story Focus – After Fall by Dan Santat</i></p> <p>The children will read an adapted, heart-felt story of the well-known nursery rhyme 'Humpty Dumpty'. They will discuss the theme of positivity, develop an understanding of growth mindset, and develop ways to overcome their fears.</p> <p>The children will be encouraged to participate in group games and challenges to develop social skills such as turn taking, teamwork and communication.</p>

All of the children will experience some sort of transition or change; whether that be starting a new school/high school, moving to a new class or moving into a new year group. The children will be given the opportunity to discuss if they have any anxieties about these changes and then be given support to develop strategies to help manage a variety of transitions that they may experience.</p> <p data-bbox="780 853 1327 996">The children will be encouraged to participate in group games and challenges to develop social skills such as turn taking, teamwork and communication.</p>
